What is changing and why?





What is changing and why?

The Federal Reserve Banks are adopting a new standard format for transmitting wire transfers and related messages

This update will:

- Update the wire transfer format to the ISO 20022 standard
- Allow more structured information
- Allow more detailed information
- Same standard used by other wire systems
 - More compatible with other domestic and international systems
 - Easier to map between systems and more efficiently send messages that will involve multiple payment systems
- This will impact wires sent via PATH
- There will be no change to foreign wires sent via CXI (External Systems)





What is changing and why?

Some of the benefits:

- Greater flexibility
- More available fields
 - More structured
- Greater space available for longer names and longer addresses
- New options for easier communication and investigations





Message types and definitions





You will see PATH refer to Legacy Wire – this is the FAIM format

PATH will refer to the new format as Wires – These are the transactions using the ISO 20022 format

This will be important to note when setting up new templates

Also, when searching for past transactions after March 10, 2025

Templates

- The wire templates in PATH will need to be updated prior to March 10, 2025
- PATH users with access to wires will be able to start creating templates in the ISO 20022 format on January 7, 2025 (today)

- ✓ Required TESTING




